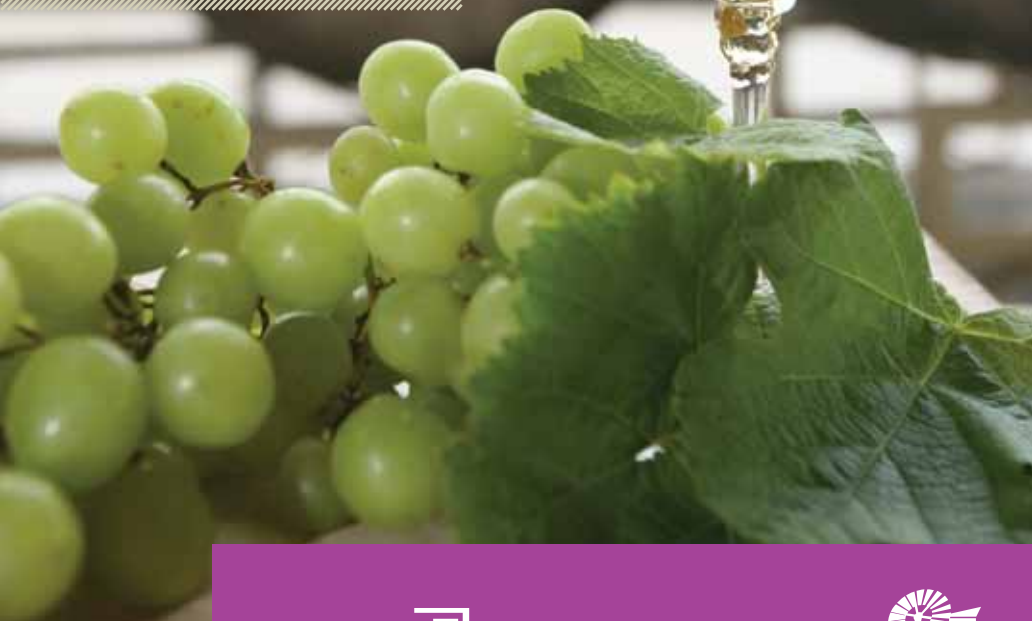

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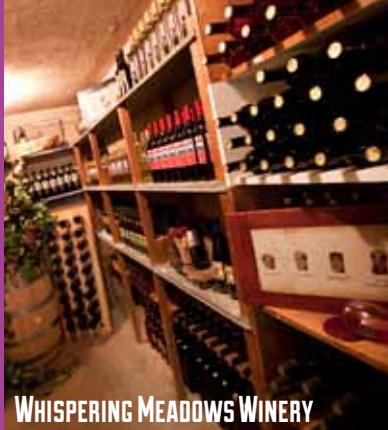

Oklahoma's first brush with the fruit of the vine predates statehood in 1907, when growing grapes and making wine were part of settling the frontier. By the 1920s, wine production was a significant component to Oklahoma's agricultural economy. Prohibition and the Dust Bowl put the kibosh on Oklahoma's first foray into the wine industry, and even after the repeal of Prohibition in 1959, it wasn't until the mid-1990s that farmers seeking new streams of revenue turned again to grapes and wine-making. The move brought an ancient craft to life once again, and because grapes are thought to reflect the character of the soil where they are grown, Oklahoma's distinctive essence is captured in palate-pleasing wines and an eclectic mix of wineries and tasting rooms. Vineyards and wineries have since blossomed across the state, creating a vibrant industry with a piquant bouquet all its own.





WINE & TRIVIA & FUN FACTS

ANSWERS

1. **c.** Fill a bucket with ice and cold water to ensure that the cold temperature is distributed to the bottle evenly.
2. **a.** Sugar content. Once yeast is added, it turns the residual sugar into alcohol (ethanol). The higher amounts of initial sugar in the grape, the higher the alcohol content will be.
3. **c.** Using red grapes but only exposing the grape to the skins for a short period of time (often 1-3 days). Red wine is exposed to skins for a much longer period.
4. **b.** 55°F. Wine stored at too cold of a temperature can dull the flavors, but if it's stored at too warm of a temperature, it will age at an accelerated rate and might deteriorate before it can reach its peak.
5. **a.** Prevent the cork from drying out and shrinking, which allows air to get in and spoil the wine.
6. **b.** Only send back the wine if it is spoiled.
7. **b.** 3-5 years. After this, a good grapevine should be able to bear fruit for about 40 years.
8. **b.** To avoid becoming drunk. Because wine tasters often have so many wines to evaluate, many spit out the wine to reduce their alcohol consumption. This allows them to evaluate each wine while keeping their wits.

DID YOU KNOW?

- Every state in America has a winery.
- A short 10 years ago, Oklahoma was ranked 49 in the number of wineries only above Alaska. Today, Oklahoma ranks 5th in nation with more than 60 wineries and we are growing strong.
- It takes between 50-100 pounds of pulling force to extract a cork.
- A glass of white table wine has around 84 calories, while a glass of red table wine has around 150 calories.
- To trill is a technique used to help deliver the wine's aromas to the retro nasal passages. By taking a sip of wine and inhaling with your lips slightly parted, air passes over the wine.

ADVENTURES IN WINE TASTING

Tasting wine can be the ultimate in culinary adventuring, but unless you're an accomplished wine connoisseur, you might feel intimidated at the thought of visiting a tasting room. Relax. The point of tasting wine is simply to find wines you enjoy. There really is no right or wrong when it comes to tasting. That being said, a few basic guidelines can help you in your quest to find wines pleasing to your taste.

1. Start with a clear wine glass.
2. Pour just a little wine, or tasting room personnel will pour it for you. An inch or less is best. If you're tasting several wines, start with the lightest; white wines, move to roses, and finally to the reds. You might wish to sip water between wines to clear your palate.
3. Notice the color of the wine. White wines gain color as they age; red wines lose color.
4. Holding the glass by the stem, swirl the wine a couple of times by gently moving the glass in a circular motion, which aerates the wine and releases the vapors for you to smell.
5. Put your nose over the rim of the glass and breathe in. Every wine is different, and because wine grapes tend to pick up the flavors of the soil, you might be able to pick up aromas like berries or vanilla, or the scent of certain fruits or flowers.
6. Sip, not gulp, and let the wine slide across all parts of your tongue, noticing as many sensations as you can. If you want, you may swallow the wine, but if you plan to taste a number of wines, you will usually be provided with a vessel to spit out the wine. It's not considered rude to do so.
7. Tasting room employees can give you background on each wine and more in-depth instructions on tasting, so don't be afraid to ask questions.
8. Most importantly, relax and take pleasure in the process of finding a wine you'll enjoy!

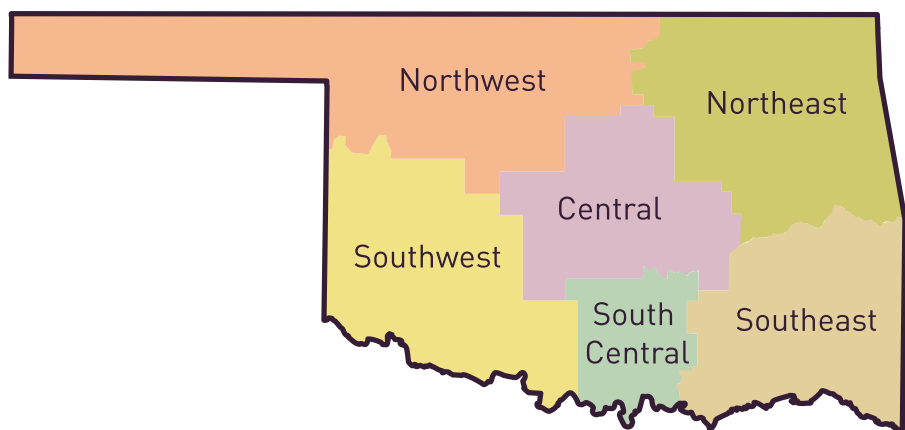

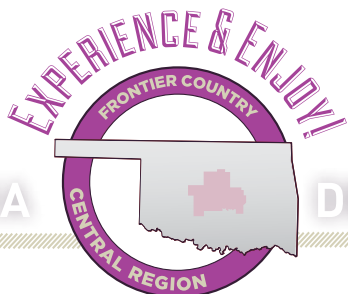

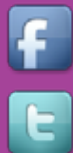
